Celebrating 15 Years of Partnership

Fifteen years ago a *dream took root* among several faith communities in Maria Auxiliadora, Dominican Republic (DR), and in Calgary, Canada. The *shared dream* was to holistically improve the lives of Dominican youth and their families living in poverty. Over time that *dream has become reality* as the partners, along with others from health, education and business fields, have steadily worked together in *growing* long-term community development programs. church relief outreach, youth camps, health programs, sports initiatives, water purification projects, and microfinance initiatives are bringing stability and hope to the community of Maria Auxiliadora.

The *shared desire* was mutual transformation as the communities committed to caring, working, learning, praying, and sharing with each other. Each of the faith communities in the DR and in Canada have been "mutually encouraged by each other's faith" (Romans 1:12). The partnering Canadian churches report that the relationship

with their Dominican brothers and sisters has expanded their faith and given new desire to establish and maintain meaningful relationships with the churches' local neighborhoods and their other church-supported partners. The El Camino and Soto churches have grown in their desire to provide hope to their communities as they share God's love and offer life-giving programs for those living in challenging contexts.

Dream Becomes Reality

The high school, built out of recycled shipping containers, provides an affordable, sustainable structure. However, it is the high quality education that has born fruit: the highest grades in the district!

TEARS El Camino School just celebrated the graduation of their first class of grade 12 students. These students, who represent some of the most vulnerable families in the barrio, received quality education, meals and nurturing support over the 12 years they attended the TEARS School. These students are recognized as <u>role models and leaders</u> in their community. All of them plan to continue with post-secondary education.

The El Camino water purification plant has recently expanded to offer home delivery of low-cost, pure water. Over 30,000 gallons per month are sold in 5-gallon jugs at below market prices. Purified water for drinking and cooking helps improve the health of families and students.

A Calgary-based nurse shared that the partnership has <u>transformed her practice</u> to one that focuses on equity, trust and collaboration. Many other individuals who have participated in trips to the DR have been impacted in their personal and professional lives.
